
For this year only, the show will be a 4-day event running from July 6 to July 9, 2011. Along with the usual Concours there will be a

Member Profile: Barry Hanover

This month's *Member Profile* features a new club member, Barry Hanover.

Barry asserts he was a mechanical engineer from birth. He bought his first car, a Datsun 1200, at age 16 in Memphis TN, and before long he was on a first name basis with every one of its nuts and bolts. To aid in its maintenance he bought and built a Heathkit dwell meter which he still uses.

Barry's dad was an attorney and loved cars, though he had no special mechanical aptitude. In later life he bought Barry's mom a Rolls Royce Corniche convertible, which made waves when she used it to shop at Costco and other discount shops in the Memphis area.



In 1977 Barry moved to Utah to do graduate study in Mechanical and Biomedical Engineering with Stephen C. Jacobsen, a famously innovative U. of U. engineering professor. Barry arrived in a Datsun 510 towing a motorcycle, and caused quite a stir when he did a clutch job on the Datsun by parking the front wheels on the curb in his apartment parking lot and dropping the transmission onto his chest under the car.

He bought his first house near Trolley Square, a bungalow he became sold on when he saw the garage had a grease pit. Barry lost no time carpeting and equipping it with a lawn chair and a mini bar, to add comfort

to his tinkering.

After finishing his Masters degree Barry went to work at Sarcos, one of Jacobsen's start up companies. Barry played important roles in the design and perfection of several famous Utah engineering feats, including the dextrous robotic hand, wearable kidney, and life-like enter-

tainment robots. The latter include the Phantom Manor and Pirates of the Caribbean figures at Euro Disney near Paris.

Particularly meaningful to Barry is his work updating the control mechanisms for the Abe Lincoln figure that arises from a chair and converses with the audience. Barry first saw this Abe at age 10 at the New York World's Fair, and it is still in service 40+ years later at the Disneyland in Anaheim CA.

Later Barry was VP of Engineering at OEC Medical Systems near the Salt Lake airport, which made

fluoroscopic Xray equipment for surgical applications. Most recently he worked at Technicscan, another biomedical imaging equipment firm.

Barry lives with his wife Allison Richards Brunvand in Jeremy Ranch in a gracious home near the top of the development with an expansive view and a three car garage with lift. He has a son attending Loyola Marymount College in Los Angeles.

Barry's love of Jaguars began with a modern XK8, and recently morphed into a deep desire for an XK120. This was satisfied by the find of a well preserved 1951 XK120 Open Two Seater on the Internet. The car was delivered to his home in Jeremy Ranch this Fall, and he confirmed its sound condition by fun drives

around Summit County until the snow flew. He is now embarking on a body off complete restoration project, with coachwork, paint and interior to be done by local Jaguar experts, and engine and chassis work to be done himself.

Barry joined the WMJR as soon as he took possession of his XK120, and eagerly looks forward to benefiting from and contributing to the resources of the club.

Let's all welcome Barry and his wonderful car into our fold and make sure his "cat scratch fever" is never cured.



