(1) 1-off Mercedes 500K barn find discovered in South Central, Los Angeles salvage yard

From Jan. 28, 2012: Being agriculturally inclined to build barns in the country, we don't expect barn finds to turn up in the middle of a high-turnover metropolis. Yet that's been happening more regularly of late, and writer Michael Mraz has found another example in South Central, Los Angeles: a one-of-one Mercedes-Benz 1935 Caracciola 500K built especially for Silver Arrows race driver Rudolph Caraccioloa. More

(2) Paul Newman's last race car to be auctioned

From March 10, 2012: Back in the 1980s some wouldn't think twice about chopping the roof off Steve McOueen's old Ferrari 275 GTB4 in order to replicate one of the superrare 275 NART Spiders commissioned in the 1960s by U.S. Ferrari importer Luigi Chinetti. (5) Priciest accident ever? \$31million Ferrari crashes in France

From July 14, 2012: It was a prized Ferrari, one of a rare model known as the "Picasso of motoring" that is often included by elite automobile magazines among the top wheels in the world. Now its owner, American businessman Christopher Cox, has a new and less desirable distinction: Driver in what could be the most costly car crash ever seen. The Ferrari 250 GTO smashed into another car during a parade of pricey race cars through France, breaking the leg of his wife Ann Cox and sending two passengers in the other car to the hospital, the British newspaper Metro reported. (6) Senna's Toleman to be auctioned

From March 24, 2012: The car that Senna took that legendary second place at the Monaco GP and a third place at the British GP in 1984, this Toleman TG184-2 was the car that gave Ayrton his first shot in F1—holding a special place in history for many F1 fans. The iconic racer has been fully recommissioned, and is ready to race. More

(8) Steve McQueen Le Mans 1968 Ford GT40 Gulf/Mirage — 2012 Monterey Auctions

From June 14, 2012: From that magic era where Ford and Ferrari were fighting toe-to-toe in the racing world, this stellar Gulf/Mirage Lightweight Racing Car, chassis P/1074 is ready to roll onto the auction block at Monterey in August. To make things really interesting, this isn't your average race-spec GT40 by any stretch of the imagination. For starters, it's the first lightweight racing chassis produced for the J.W.A./Gulf Racing

team. Gulf's iconic powder blue paint job with one wide marigold stripe is easily the most recognizable livery for the GT40, and of the 133 GT40's ever produced, the most desirable as well. More

(9) Pebble Beach winning Mercedes

From Sept. 1, 2012: Arguably the most desirable prize in the classic-car world, the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance Best of Show award was won by a 1928 Mercedes Benz 680 S Saoutchik Torpedo Roadster. Combining the sophisticated chassis and engine developed by Ferdinand Porsche with the everstriking lines of Jacques Saoutchik, it was certainly a well-deserved winner. The car was one of about a dozen built with this style and was originally ordered by an American

who did not take delivery. To add to its appeal, Mercedes Benz had the car repainted and it had been yellow until the recent restoration by Paul Russell. More

(10) Classic Ferrari Testa Rossa comes up for auction

From Jan. 14, 2012: A rare 1956 Ferrari 500 Testa Rossa will be the star at the first auction of the 2012 season when it comes under the hammer at the 2012 Scottsdale Auctions organized by Gooding and Company in Scottsdale, Ariz., on Jan. 20-21. Preceding the legendary 250 GT Testa Rossa, the 500 was the first Ferrari to use the Testa Rossa name. The 1956 Ferrari 500 Testa Rossa being presented is one of just 17 examples produced and one of the most extensively campaigned four-cylinder cars to race in the United States. More

Jaguar Unveils Speedboat

Project developed in partnership with Ivan Erdevicki Yacht Design

Jaguar Cars has unveiled the 'Concept Speedboat by Jaguar Cars' a prototype created alongside its new XF Sportbrake. The latest addition to the British car manufacturer's portfolio features a 20-footer speedboat developed in partnership with the yacht design studio Ivan Erdevicki.

Ian Callum, director of design at Jaguar, comments: "We recognize that both our existing and future customers enjoy diverse and active lifestyles. With the launch of the new Jaguar XF Sportbrake, we had an opportunity to create a vision of how our design philosophy might be applied to an alternative product, in which speed and beauty are also priorities."

Callum says that the new model follows, "the idea of a traditional speedboat but with the sleek and fast characteristics that you would expect from a Jaguar car".

The Concept Speedboat features a gel coat fiberglass hull finished with natural teak decking. This is split by a carbon fibre fin, inspired by the iconic Jaguar D-Type. The front of the boat flows seamlessly into the screen and the red 2+1 cabin follows the sporting character of Jaguar cars. Jaguar Cars' heritage is also subtly recognized with fuel filler

caps inspired by the Series 1 XJ. A polished aluminum propeller and pop-up mooring post imitates how the boat could be powered and docked respectively.

The 'Concept Speedboat by Jaguar Cars' is a design project that was commissioned to support the launch of the XF Sportbrake and was developed in conjunction with naval architecture and yacht design consultancy Ivan Erdevicki, and Yacht concept design consultancy by Seventy Seven Design.

Unfortunately Jaguar has no plans to build or commercialize the boat.
