



Prince Harry Takes Part in Goodwood Track Day



His Royal Highness Prince Harry made his Goodwood Motor Circuit debut today (Saturday, February 15), as part of a track day run by the Royal Foundation Endeavour Fund.

After being greeted by Lord March, owner of Goodwood Motor Circuit, Prince Harry completed a handful of adrenalineueled laps of the historic circuit in a classic Aston Martin DB4, before another high-speed run, this time in a Lamborghini Gallardo.

Following laps in a Jaguar F-Type and an Aston Martin V8 Vantage, he met injured servicemen that have been helped by the Endeavour Fund and visited an exhibition of the Royal Foundation's projects, before paying a visit to the Boultbee Flying Academy, based at Goodwood Aerodrome.

Lord March said: "We're delighted to have Prince Harry attend a track day here at the Goodwood Motor Circuit and to support the work of the Royal Foundation Endeavour Fund, which has established some wonderful projects to help injured service personnel. As a former Royal Air Force base, Goodwood has a connection with military service that stretches back 75 years, so it's something that we feel quite a part of."

007 An Alcoholic

I have often thought that James Bond drinks too much alcohol, enough to impair his skill in fights, car chases and seduction. Now a scientific survey has been carried out by three doctors who are consultants at Nottingham University Hospital, reported in the British Medical Journal.

They read all 14 Bond books, taking notes on every drink mentioned, usually vodka martinis. They excluded days when Bond would have been unable to drink because of imprisonment or other such reasons. They found that he drank an average of 92 units a week, which is a little over four times the NHS recommendation




that men should drink no more than 21 units per week. [*Ed. note*: a unit is 10ml; a typical drink contains 1—3 units]

This puts him "in the highest risk group for malignancies, depression,

hypertension and cirrhosis. He is also at high risk of suffering sexual dysfunction, which would considerably affect his womanizing", they conclude. "It works out at about half a bottle of vodka a day, and I don't think you'd be happy with someone defusing a nuclear bomb who'd just downed a half bottle of spirits", says Patrick Davies, one of the doctors.


They conclude that Bond was a chronic alcoholic, who would have been expected to die in his mid fifties. His creator, Ian Fleming, died at age 56 of heart disease after a life of alcohol and tobacco excess.
